1. Introduction

The meeting voted unanimously in favour of all officers being re-elected.

The External Chair confirmed that this met with the APPG rules and that as all was in order, she could leave the meeting.

7. Appointment of Secretariat

The re-appointment of the Loan Charge Action Group as the APPG's secretariat was proposed by Greg Smith MP and seconded by Grahame Morris MP. All agreed.

8. APPG Activity

The Chair explained suggested activities the APPG could be conducting in the next 12 months

- Response to McCann Review into settlement terms APPG Officers had recently met with the Exchequer Secretary to the Treasury (XST) and requested that he make a separate statement on the review to any made in the budget. They had also questioned the restrictive scope given to Ray McCann. Lastly the XST had been asked how this could be prevented happening again.
 - Proposed action:
 - Once published, the review results should be shared with APPG members.
 - The APPG should meet shortly after the results of the review are announced (in December if possible).
 - Request a meeting with the XST.
 - Request a follow-up meeting with Ray McCann.

- Letter on S.684 (pre 2010) cases from constituent feedback, it looks as though HMRC are ramping up demands from those where they have used this to circumvent the Government accepted recommendations of the Morse review. It's as though they want to do this prior to the results of the McCann review becoming available. The APPG had sent a letter to the previous Government on HMRC's use of s.684 notices on 8th April 2024 to which a reply was never received.
 - o Proposed action: New APPG letter to be written on this to the current Government.
- Meeting with accountancy / tax sector professional bodies (CIOT, ICAEW, ACCA) this follows publication of a damning report by the Loan Charge Action Group exposing the report of chartered accounts in recommending schemes.
 - Proposed action: Secretariat to setup a meeting with professional bodies to discuss the recent report, letter to be written to each one challenging them on this and inviting them to the meeting.
- **Meeting about HMRC powers** HMRC have now got powers to take directly from individual's bank accounts. Given the mistakes that they have made with Loan Charge victims, the unrestricted powers that they have and taxpayer safeguards are a matter of concern.
 - Proposed action: Secretariat to share information on this and arrange a meeting in 2026.
- Look into why illegitimate tax avoidance schemes are not shut down
 - Look into which public body (if any HMRC/FSA) is responsible for shutting down schemes.
 - Potentially have a meeting on this.
